

POSITION STATEMENT ON IMPROVING QUALITY IN PHYSIOLOGICAL SERVICES (IQIPS)

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INTRODUCTION

2018 saw the first cardiology departments gain IQIPS accreditation. The feedback from these 'early adopters' is that the process has been challenging but has stimulated positive changes.

IQIPS is an assessment and accreditation scheme that aims to improve the quality of physiology services – assuring high standards of care and safety for patients. It is strongly supported by NHS England and the Royal College of Physicians, and is recognised by the Care Quality Commission (CQC).

The IQIPS Standard is owned by the professional societies that represent the eight physiology disciplines. For cardiac this is BHRS, SCST and BSE. BHRS guidelines and standards are used by the United Kingdom Accreditation Service (UKAS) as a basis to assess device follow-up clinics in IQIPS assessments. UKAS is the UK's national accreditation body, appointed by Government; it runs schemes including accreditation for diagnostic imaging, medical laboratories, point of care testing, and dental services.
